 A committee member asked if there was a firmer timeline on the ultimate outcome of the Project? LS advised that at this stage, South32 is continuing to assess all options, with no firm timeline on an expected decision.

## **Operational Update – AMF**

- Longwall (LW) 17 continues to progress with approximately 500 metres remaining
- We expect to complete LW17 in late August / early September 2021
- Preparation for the longwall change out is planned to commence in late August 2021.
- Despite recent challenging conditions in some of the development areas, progress is improving in each of the development panels.
- Works have commenced along the Lower Portal Road.
- NB: The intent of Lower Portal Road is to provide a safe and serviceable secondary means of access / egress of the Dendrobium drift portal. The road is currently in poor condition and this upgrade will support continued access to the drift portal. It is not part of the mine extension project.
- A committee member suggested that the communications around the Lower Portal Road works should provide some further context on the need and extent of the work.
- Another member highlighted that a recent tour of the proposed work area provided good context to assist in their understanding of the planned works.
- LS noted that an offer to inspect the proposed work area was made to the residents through the recent letterbox drop.

## Environment Update – CS

- Underground water balance has increased following rainfall in March and April.
- LDP 5 flow in May was an average of 8.15 ML/day (max: 9.49 ML/d and min: 2.30 ML/d).
- Directional noise monitoring system is being progressed. All five monitors have been installed. Software set up continues.
- Noise monitoring undertaken in May 2021. There were no identified breaches of the conditions of consent.
- ISO 14001 audit undertaken. No non-conformances identified.
- Management plan updates:
  - $\circ$  Traffic updated and approved. To be uploaded to South32 webpage.
  - Noise updated and approved. To be uploaded.
  - Bushfire reviewed and available on the South32 webpage.
  - Lighting and Visual Amenity reviewed. To be uploaded.
  - Air Approved. EPL variation to be progressed. High volume samplers and depositional dust gauges will be removed once variation received. Optical photometers have arrived.
  - Waste, Water, Landscape currently under review.

	٠	A community member asked how the significance of the recorded impacts were determined (i.e. Level 1, 2, 3). CS advised that impact significance was generally detailed in the relevant Trigger Action Response Plan.

	<u>Comm</u>	unity Update
	•	Dendrobium has received 21 complaints regarding our operations since the last meeting. The primary concern raised was noise related.
	•	All complaints are responded to within 24 hours, investigated and action taken where required. <b>NOTE: community call line (1800 102 210) is resourced 24/7; complaints and</b>
		enquiries are also able to be submitted via email to <u>illawarracommunity@south32.net</u>
	•	Additional bus runs initiated to help alleviate traffic concerns.
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	•	LS informed that IMC has triggered a "Grievance" process in order to find a resolution to a particular community member's complaints/concern. This allows for a mutually respectful
		solution to formalise all concerns under a "Grievance" with the assistance of a 3 <sup>rd</sup> party
		independent facilitator.
