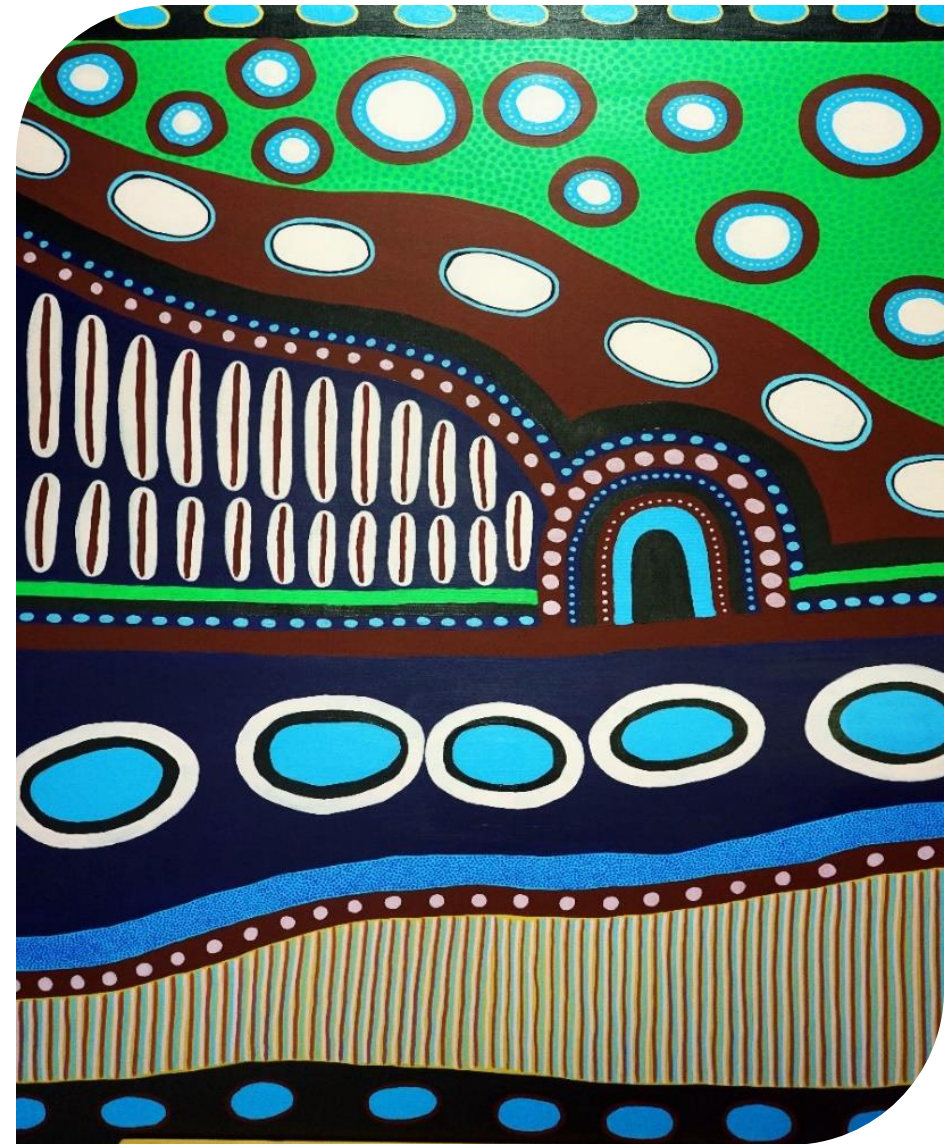

BUSINESS UPDATE

South 32 Quarterly Report March 2026

Alumina productions has increased by approx. 1% year to date across South 32 portfolio, largely driven by record production in Brazil

Worsley Update

Production remains strong and broadly stable

Q3 production of 886Kt Alumina. 6% decrease on same Quarter last FY (minor quarterly variability linked to weather conditions)

YTD Alumina production on track 2.8Mt Alumina

Mine Development

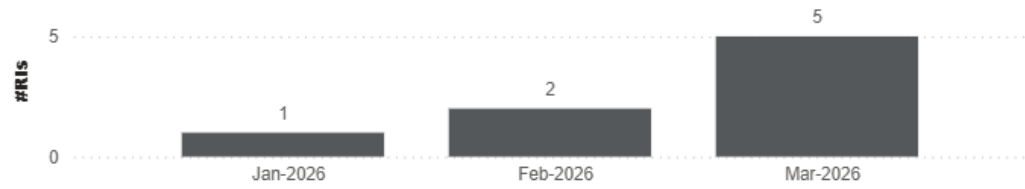
Work progressing on developing new mine areas associated with recent approval. Nullaga development on track.

Worsley Alumina Production Trend (2-Year View, Indicative)

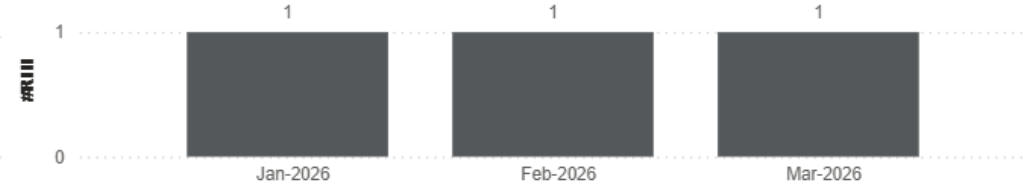

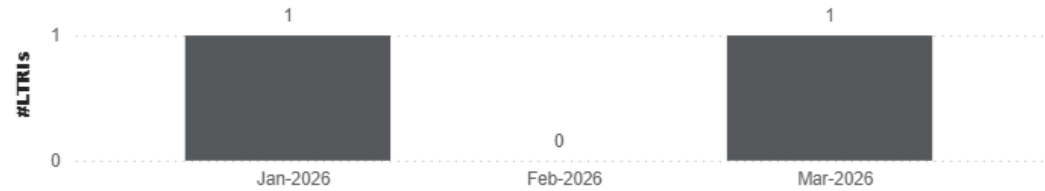
Total Recordable Injuries



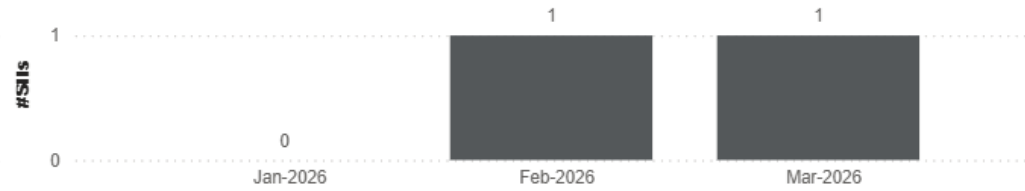
Total Recordable Illnesses



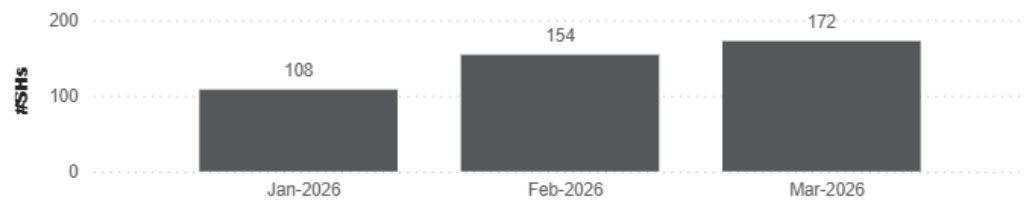
Total Lost Time Injuries



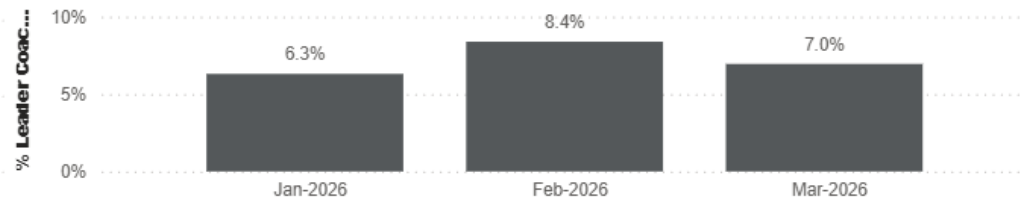
Significant Injuries and Illnesses

SOUTH32 BUSINESS UPDATE - SAFETY



Worsley is taking a significant step forward in vehicle interaction controls, with a trial of the Level 9 Vehicle Intervention System (VIS) now underway in five haul trucks at the Boddington Bauxite Mine (BBM).

The trial forms part of our broader Mobile Equipment Collision Avoidance (MECA) program, which is focused on reducing the risk of vehicle interactions.

OPERATIONAL UPDATE

PRODUCTION MINE & MATERIALS



Environment

- Planning is underway to commence Spring surveys. It is anticipated that 1000ha will be surveyed during this process including buffer areas.

Nullaga project

- Harvesting has been completed in areas south of Gold Mine Road despite delays caused by fires.
- All major deliveries for bridge construction have now been delivered.
- Bridge construction is expected to be completed by Jan 2027.



Bauxite quality

- Alumina expected to be at lower limit of traditional specification until first ore is delivered by Nullaga project.
- Oxalate is current focus with challenge to balance high alumina/high oxalate mining inventory to ensure the overall oxalate in the bauxite is as low as possible, whilst ensuring bauxite supply is maintained.

FY26 highlights include:

- Total Material Movement ahead of plan (34.7Mt delivered vs 29.9Mt planned)
- Blast hole drilling behind plan (820Km drilled vs 878Km planned)
- Bauxite conveyed slightly behind plan (16.2Mt delivered vs 16.9Mt planned)
- Dozer Rehab ahead of plan - (15Khrs delivered vs 12khrs planned)

APPROVALS UPDATE

Worsley is proposing to convert BRDA 5, Cell 7 into a decant pond to increase process water storage capacity

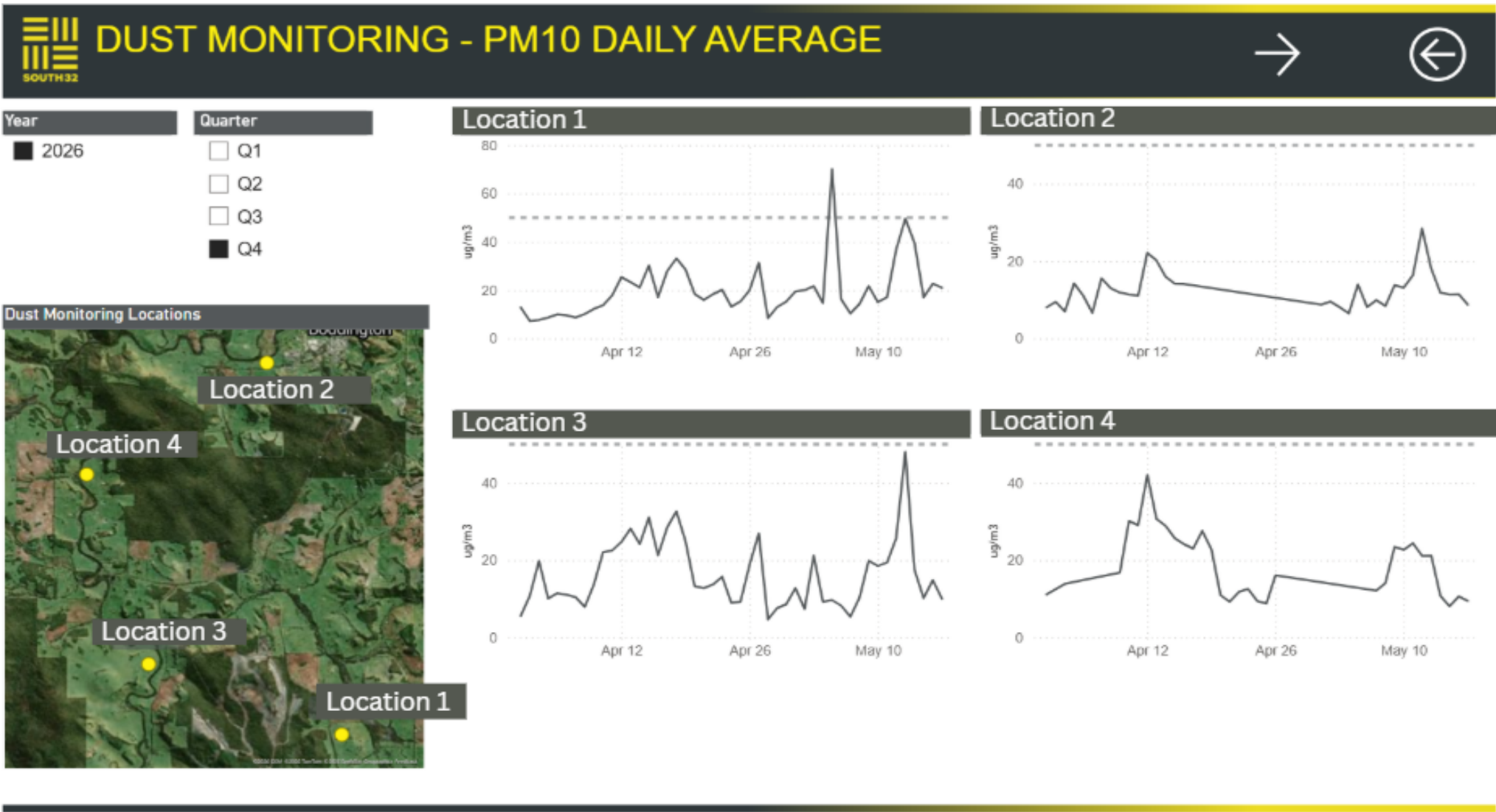
This will ensure there is sufficient storage capacity to contain a series of wet winters (mitigate overflow risks)

The following environmental approvals are required:

- *Alumina Refinery (Worsley) Agreement Act 1973* – Ministerial Consent, received 5 May 2026
- *Environmental Protection Act 1986* – Part V Works Approval

Works approval application has been signed
and will be submitted to DWER soon.

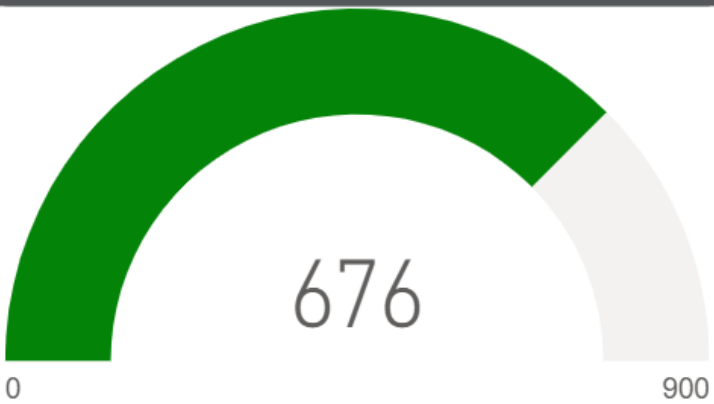
Annual Production Bore Abstraction

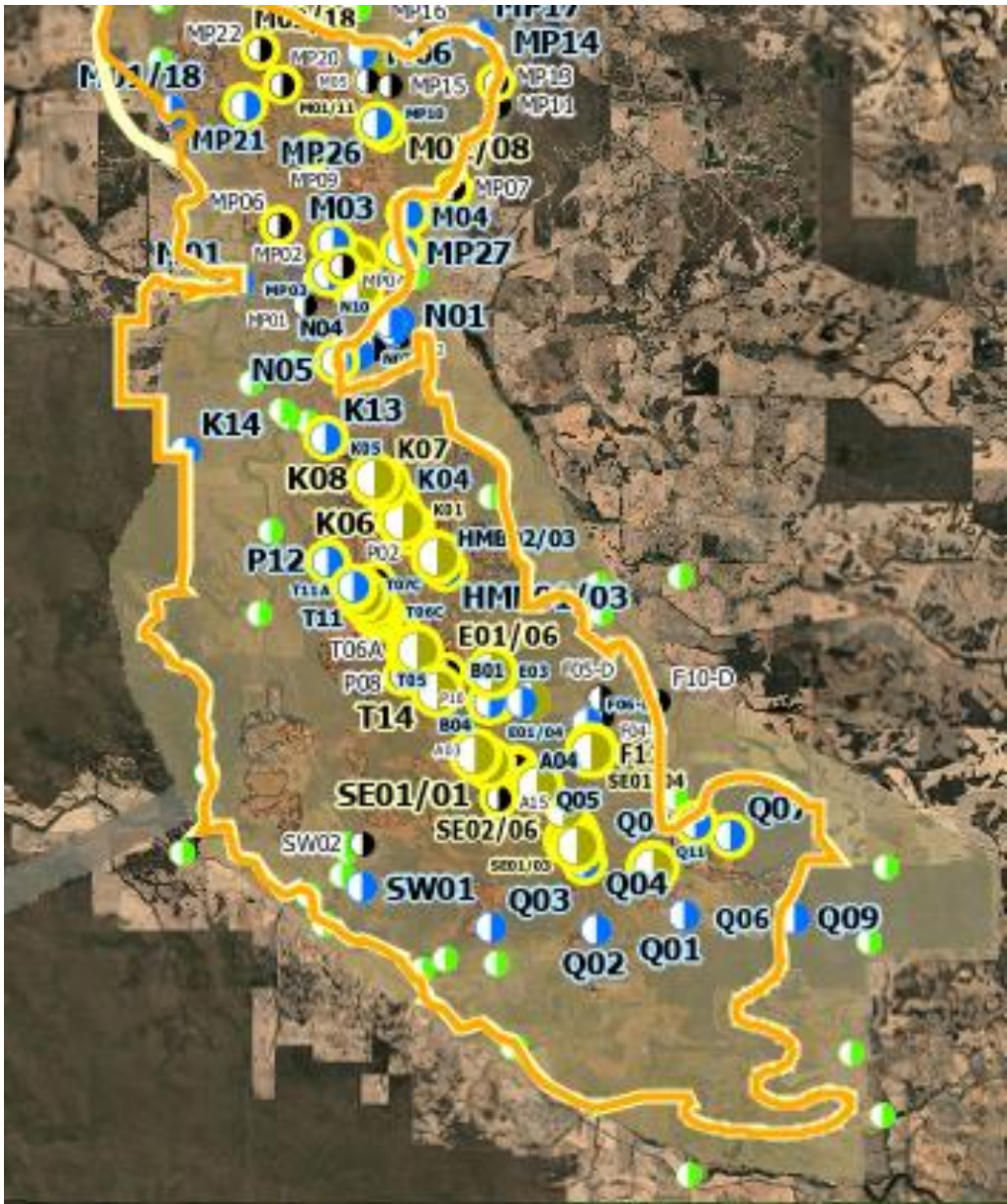

ENVIRONMENT – BBM WATER MONITORING

- All field and lab data is uploaded into a data management system called EquiS
- Power BI is used to generate compliance monitoring dashboards
- Triggers and thresholds are built into the system to alert the environment team
- Management actions detailed in the WMP are implemented for any triggers and thresholds



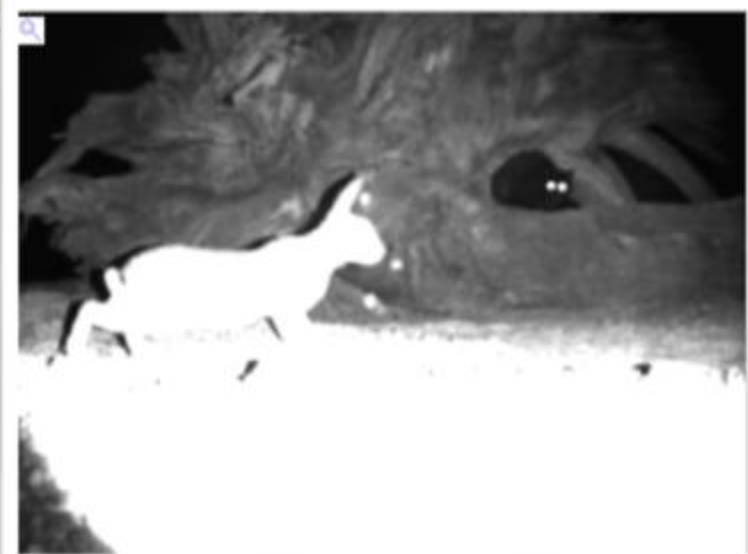

Yarning Circle Project Takes a Major Step Forward

The Boddington Community Yarning Circle project has reached an important milestone, with the detailed design now finalised following acceptance by the Aboriginal Reference Group. The endorsed design reflects extensive cultural input, with a strong focus on creating a space for learning, storytelling, gathering and cultural recognition.

With the design endorsed, the project has now moved into the construction phase. Ground works have commenced and temporary fencing is in place to ensure safety while construction activities progress. Temporary changes to RV parking will apply during the works to reduce disruption, with alternative arrangements available.

The project is funded by South32 Worsley Alumina, whose support has enabled this significant initiative to move from concept to construction. Once completed, the Yarning Circle will provide a meaningful place of connection and reflection for both residents and visitors, celebrating culture, community and Country.

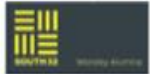

COMMUNITY UPDATE

Community Grants Program - **EXTENDED TO 31 May**

The South32 Worsley Alumina Community Grants Program is getting a major refresh in 2026 - bigger, better and designed to give local groups more time, more support and more impact.

For the past two years, we've run two grant rounds annually, offering up to \$5,000 for community projects across the Shires of Boddington, Collie, Murray, Wandering, Waroona and Williams, as well as Greater Bunbury and surrounds. After listening to community feedback and reviewing the program, we're making some important improvements.

What's New in 2026? One Bigger Round, More Time to Apply

Instead of two short rounds, we're moving to one annual grant round, open for a full two months - March and April. This gives community groups more breathing room to plan, collaborate and prepare strong applications.

Increased Funding - up to \$10,000

We know many groups have big ideas that need bigger support. That's why the funding limit is increasing to \$10,000 for projects that meet key criteria - helping more long-term, high-impact initiatives come to life.

More Support for Applicants - We are working on a new look campaign to help spread the word. Plus, we're planning grant writing workshops and tutorials tailored specifically to the South32 Worsley Alumina Community Grants Program. These sessions will help community groups feel confident and ready to put their best application forward. Stay tuned for dates and details.

COMMUNITY UPDATE - FY26

September/October 2025

17 complaints / 13 complaints related to BBM:

- 5 x Dust
- 5 x Noise
- 1 x Traffic – Lower Hotham Road Traffic Management Plan reduced speed limit on public road due to proximity to construction, OBC traffic crossing, and deteriorating road conditions.
- 1 x Stakeholder Engagement – proactive notification sent to incorrect audience.
- 1 x Lighting – SW50 waste dump light was turned off immediately after complaint received.

November/December 2025

53 complaints / 42 x complaints related to BBM:

- 15 x Dust
- 21 x Noise
- 1 x Environment (rubbish blown from mine site onto Ashcroft Road)
- 2 x Traffic (Reviewed Traffic Management Plan - Lower Hotham & Pinjarra-Williams Road)
- 2 x Blasting
- 1 x Light (light direction redirected immediately after complaint received)

January/February 2026

37 complaints / 35 complaints related to BBM:

- 18 x Dust
- 16 x Noise
- 1 x Traffic – truck air breaks

March/April 2026

31 complaints related to BBM:

- 9 x Dust
- 20 x Noise
- 2 x Other – amended blast time & lighting
