WANDERING LIONS FIRE UP NEW BBQ TRAILER

The Lions Club of Wandering is set to continue its long tradition of bringing the community together, following the successful upgrade of its BBQ trailer.

After many years of reliable service, the Club's original trailer had reached the end of its use-by date and was becoming increasingly difficult to maintain.

With support from the South32 Worsley Alumina Community Grants Program, the Lions were able to purchase a replacement trailer and have it fully refurbished locally.

The upgraded setup includes a solar-powered battery system, enabling internal lighting and external floodlights to operate efficiently — improving both functionality and sustainability.

The trailer was recently put through its paces at a 'christening' event, where the BBQ, bain-marie and kitchen facilities all performed exceptionally well.

Since forming in 1979, the Lions Club has been a supporter of the Wandering community, contributing to events, fundraising and local initiatives.

South32 Worsley Alumina, which has operated in the region for more than 40 years, continues to support community-led projects through its grants program, investing in initiatives that deliver lasting benefits for the South West and Peel.

The Lions' new trailer is a great example of that support in action — ensuring local volunteers can continue their important work for years to come.

SUPPORTING EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

We've partnered with the Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP) in Boddington to strengthen emergency preparedness for vulnerable members of the community.

Following recent fire events in the region, the importance of being prepared for unexpected disruptions has been further highlighted, particularly for older residents living independently.

To help address this need, we're supporting the CHSP "2Go Bag" initiative through a donation.

The initiative will provide each recipient with a practical kit containing essential items such as toiletries, a small esky for storing medications, a water bottle, notepads, pens, and bags to help keep important belongings ready in the event of an emergency.

This initiative will help CHSP clients better prepare for potential evacuations or unexpected situations, enhancing both safety and peace of mind.

HUGE INTEREST IN NATIVE PLANT PROGRAM

High community demand has driven the success of the Shire of Boddington's inaugural Native Plant Subsidy and Backyard Tree Planting Program, with interest exceeding expectations by more than four times.

The response saw the program significantly expanded, putting thousands of native plants into the hands of local landholders and residents to support revegetation, biodiversity and shade across properties.

Funding from Worsley Alumina helped make that possible, backing additional plants to meet demand and supporting 1,200 tree guards to protect new growth.

COMMUNITY LIAISON COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Community Liaison Committee (CLC) met on 19 May, bringing together community representatives and South32 to share updates, discuss priorities and raise local matters.

Key discussion points included:

PERFORMANCE AND DEVELOPMENT

Operations at Worsley continue to deliver steady results, with overall performance remaining stable.

Progress also continues on key future developments, with the Nullaga project advancing as planned and expected to support future mining activities.

SAFETY INNOVATION

Safety remains a top priority, with new technology trials underway to further reduce risk across operations.

A Vehicle Intervention System is currently being trialled in haul trucks at the Boddington Bauxite Mine, as part of a broader collision avoidance program.

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

Environmental management continues to be a key focus, with large-scale surveys planned to support ongoing monitoring and planning.

Seeding and planting programs are underway alongside continued investment in biodiversity initiatives. This includes habitat creation for

native species such as black cockatoos and small mammals, and feral animal management programs.

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

Worsley continues to support a range of initiatives and events across the region, including local festivals, sporting events and programs.

The Community Grants Program was refreshed this year, with a higher funding limit per project and a simplified, extended application process to better support local groups.

ENGAGEMENT AND FEEDBACK

Community feedback remains an important part of the CLC, with noise and dust identified as the most common concerns raised by residents.

Actions have been implemented to address these issues, including adjustments to lighting, blasting and traffic management, along with ongoing compliance with environmental licence conditions.

The CLC continues to provide an important forum for open and transparent dialogue between Worsley and the community, helping ensure local perspectives are heard and considered.

With a continued focus on safety, operational performance, environmental stewardship and community investment, Worsley remains committed to delivering long-term value for the region.
