At the start of July we held a NAIDOC celebration and Indigenous Artwork unveiling ceremony at the Bunbury Port, which included a Welcome to Country from Les Wallam and a smoking ceremony led by GKB General Manager, Karim Khan. In July, the South32 Environmental team continued its important revegetation efforts with the support of the Danju Ranger Team planting an impressive 12,500 native seedlings along a local creek line in the Leschenault Catchment Council.

This marks the second consecutive year of planting in the area. Last year's seedlings are now thriving in the rich clay soils, showing strong establishment and growth - a promising sign for the long-term health of the creek and surrounding ecosystem.

#### PAVING THE WAY





## LOWER HOTHAM ROAD CLOSURE



South32 wishes to advise our neighbours of intermittent road closure at the intersection of Lower Hotham Road and the Overland Bauxite Conveyor (OBC) from 0600 – 1800 on 2 & 3 September 2025.

South 32 will be executing the cutover from overhead lines to underground power.

Road closure will be intermittent up to 30minutes each (occurring no more than four times over the two days). Traffic control will be in place for this period.
