The recent bushfires in Boddington and Wandering were a powerful reminder of the strength and resilience of our community. Our volunteer firefighters, emergency crews and local leaders worked tirelessly to protect homes and support those affected, and we are deeply grateful for their efforts.

South32 Worsley Alumina thanks everyone who stepped forward during the emergency and recovery. To support ongoing work, we have committed \$120,000 across both shires for clean up, infrastructure repair and strengthening local emergency response capability.

Community spirit has been on full display. More than 200 locals attended the Boddington Community Cookup to thank volunteers, and the Boddington Diner has been hosting the Thank You Canvas and children's colouring in competition, with messages of gratitude flowing in.

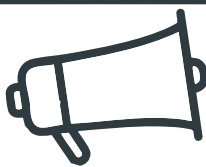

KEY TAKEAWAYS



ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT REMAINS FRONT AND CENTRE

Residents shared strong views on dust, noise, water and other impacts. Noise management, pest and weed control, and land rehabilitation rated highest, while tailings facilities, flora and fauna, and air quality were noted as opportunities for improvement.

TRUST DIPPED SLIGHTLY, WHILE ACCEPTANCE INCREASED

Acceptance reflects how comfortable people are with South32 operating locally.

MANY ARE FEELING ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS

Just over half of respondents reported impacts at home or work. Water quality, flora and fauna, and rehabilitation are the areas people most want updates on.

CONTACT WITH SOUTH32 IS COMMON AND MOSTLY POSITIVE

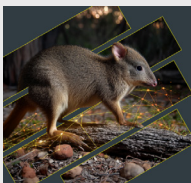
Most participants had interacted with the company in the past six months, and more than half rated those experiences positively. Email remains the preferred way to make contact.



PARTICIPATION SNAPSHOT

- 265 people completed the survey, including 46 from Boddington.
- Each survey contributed \$5 to local community groups, with more than \$8,300 donated since Local Voices began.

BODDINGTON'S SAMMI RAE NOMINATED FOR WOMEN IN RESOURCES AWARDS

Boddington is celebrating one of its own, with local resident Sammi Rae nominated in this year's Women in Resources Awards. Sammi's journey—from boarding at Harvey Agricultural College to becoming Superintendent of Drill, Blast and Exploration at South32—reflects the determination and resilience so many regional families know well.

Starting in mining as a labour hire operator, Sammi worked her way through drill and blast roles before

stepping into leadership. She's since delivered major improvements in safety, efficiency and team development. Outside of work, Sammi is known for mentoring young women, supporting inclusive career pathways and volunteering in her community.

Her nomination recognises both her professional achievements and her commitment to lifting others.

CELEBRATING YARNING CIRCLE PROGRESS

Momentum is building around the Boddington Community Yarning Circle, with the project now moving into the design development phase and construction set to begin in April 2026. This space is being created as a place for storytelling, learning and connection to Country — a gift for the community that will be enjoyed for generations.

The Yarning Circle is proposed for Boddington Memorial Park beside the Hotham River — a location of deep historical and mythological significance for Aboriginal people. It is a fitting place to honour more than 45,000 years of Indigenous history on these lands.

The emerging design includes carved totem poles, integrated artwork, Corten steel panels, two dedicated yarning areas and natural materials that reflect Noongar culture. Together, these elements will create a powerful and welcoming space that celebrates culture, community and connection.

Our support has helped bring this project to life, reflecting our ongoing commitment to strengthening relationships with the Boddington community and contributing to initiatives that honour local heritage. By backing projects like this, we're helping create shared spaces that foster cultural understanding, community pride and long lasting connection to Country.
