COMMUNITY LIAISON COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Boddington Community Liaison Committee (CLC) met in November to share updates from South32 Worsley Alumina and hear from local voices. Highlights from the meeting:

Operations: Worsley Alumina production remains steady, with planned maintenance completed and FY26 guidance unchanged.

Projects: Lower Hotham and Ashcroft Roads are being managed with traffic controls to minimise community impact. The Newmont project is progressing with minimal neighbour disruption, while the Hotham North Mine Development will extend operations beyond 2030 and reduce vehicle movements by around 1 million annually.

Environment: Rehabilitation continues across thousands of hectares; and advice was shared on keeping rainwater tanks safe.

Community: Support was provided to local events including the Careers Expo, RUOK Day, the Boddington Lions Rodeo, and more. Complaints received this year are being addressed, and residents can now opt in for text or email notifications.

Transparency: Member profiles will be published in Boddington News early 2026 to demonstrate accountability and showcase the diverse local voices on the committee.
