### 1. Meeting opened by Amanda Blunt, Deputy Chairperson

- A Tringrove - Acknowledgement of Country
- A Blunt - Apologies noted and opened the floor for nominations for Chairperson – committee selected Greg Cavanagh

### 2. Accept previous minutes & correspondence

### 3. South32 business update by Alysia Tringrove, Worsley Mining and Materials Vice President

- Reported on the quarterly results and advised the full report was available on the South32 website.
- Worsley Alumina achieved US\$239M increase in net cash position.
- Production and unit cost guidance remains unchanged for majority of South32 operations
- Entered into a sub-lease agreement with Alcoa subject to government approval for the Western Murrumbidgee Timber Reserve area.

### 4. South32 Community Relations update by Amanda Blunt, Worsley Community Specialist

- Advised 20 community complaints were received in FYTD.
- Of these, 9 were related to mine noise and resulted in modification to operations, with 1,412 hours of production time lost due to proactive noise management.
- Other causes of concern included blast noise, light spillage and dust.
- Lower Hotham Road crossing update**
- The application was lodged with the Shire of Boddington in October and Council has approved pending a public comment period.
- Community Investment update**
- The South32 Community Investment Plan resulted in identifying targeted areas for the community being:
  - Education Support – creating a link to the Boddington school community to pursue shared value and improve career pathways
  - Visiting Murrumbidgee Country – enhance the region’s visitor and tourism potential by supporting unique events and activities to the area
  - Celebrate Green – protect and enhance the natural environment and ecosystem in the Boddington area
- Worsley has partnered with Peel Harvey Catchment Council, providing more than \$75,000 over three years, to improve waterway health.
- Worsley hosted a Community Mine Open Day at its Murrumbidgee operation on Saturday 19 November.

## 5. Mine plan update by Clare Reid, Worsley Manager Planning

- Presented the 3 month mine plan for Marradong and Saddleback mine areas.
- Advised that if there is an issue with the mobile lights, please contact us to rectify.
- Presented the rolling 10 Year Mine Plan that Worsley is required to submit to State Government each year.
- Advised of Worsley's plan to extend its Environmental Approval Area. Work has commenced on consultation with landowners regarding fauna and flora surveys that are required as part of the application. Broader community consultation will occur in 2017.

## 6. General Business

- Member updates:
  - M Durack – Peel Harvey Catchment Council (PHCC) provided an update on its community investment program, weed information workshop held earlier in the month and Tunbridge Gully project progress. A Blunt – Advised that she was staying with South32 but moving to Coal Operations in NSW, introduced Louise Dell who has taken over the role of Community Relations
  - G Marston – Friends of Reserves advised collaborating with the PHCC on developing a grant application
  - I Freeman – Department of Park & Wildlife advised that there is good opportunity for South32 to work with the Aboriginal community to develop a seed collecting and native business opportunity.
  - C Littlemore – Interested in a tour of the mine and will organise a time in the near future.
